HIS WORD TODAY

“As the Lord spoke to me, the spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me: Son of man, I am sending You to the Israelites, rebels who have rebelled against Me; they and their ancestors have revolted against Me to this very day. Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending You... they shall know that a prophet has been among them.”... “A prophet is not without honor except in His native place.”

Blessed Teresa of Calcutta, spoke through kindness and compassion. May we all learn to hear and listen to the voice of God directing us through the Spirit.
