GOSPEL: Mark 7:31-37

Some people brought a deaf man who could not speak to Jesus and begged him to lay his hand on the man. Jesus opened the man's ears and cured his speech impediment. He ordered the people not to tell anyone, but they were too amazed to keep this to themselves.

HIS WORD TODAY

"He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears, and spitting, touched his tongue, then he looked up to heaven and groaned and said to him, 'Ephphatha' that is 'Be opened.' And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly... They were exceedingly astonished and they said, 'He has done all things well.'"

We can make a list of the miracles of Jesus. Some were cures from a distance, some taking one by the hand, some by a spoken word. Today we find touch, saliva, a groan and a word. We do not learn how the man reacted, but the people, ordered to remain quiet, told the story.

Each one of us, at our baptism, found the minister touching our ears and tongue and told: As Jesus made the deaf to hear and dumb to speak, so may He open your ears to hear His word and your mouth to proclaim His praise.' We were told that we, in the words of Pope Francis, are to be 'Missionary Disciples.' We have encountered Christ, turned to Him, accepted His teaching, and now are sent to live out that baptismal mandate. Though the man who was cured was anonymous, we are to tell others that He has done all things well.

2015 THE YEAR OF CONSECRATED LIFE

The initial form of consecrated life for women in the Church
was consecrated virginity according to a rite performed by
bishops and popes. Renewed interest in the ancient
ecclesial order of virgins emerged when Vatican Council II's
Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy, stated that the rite of
consecration of virgins should be revised. In 1970, a revised
rite opened the way for women to live a solitary form of
consecrated life under the auspices of the Church. Their
special mission is to pray for the needs of the local Church
and any tasks the Bishop may assign to them. They may or
may not wear a habit and veil.

Prayer to Know One's Vocation

Lord, my God and my loving Father, you have made me to
know you, to love you, to serve you, and thereby to find and
to fulfill my deepest longings. I know that you are in all
things, and that every path can lead me to you.

But of them all, there is one especially by which you
want me to come to you. Since I will do what you want of

THE ORGAN AT OUR LADY OF PITY CHURCH

Our big organ was manufactured in Macungie, Pennsylvania
by Allen Organ Corporation. Allen is the largest and best-
known American maker of church organs. It is a "digital"
musical instrument containing electronic 'chips' that contain
recordings of actual pipe organ sounds like Trumpets,
Clarinets, Flutes and Strings. These sounds are then
amplified and played through hidden speakers located
throughout the nave of the church. The organ has an
impressive sound but is so much more impressive when you
sing along with it at Mass!
